This message has been sent to all employees and students at the University of Alberta.

Alberta Health Services (AHS) has [notified](#) the University of Alberta of a person with confirmed measles on North campus who has been in a public setting while infectious. Additional locations may be released if necessary.

Individuals who were in the following locations during the specified dates and times may have been exposed to measles:

HUB Mall, University of Alberta, North Campus, 112 Street NW, Edmonton

Exposure time periods:

September 2: Exposure time: Approx. 10:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. (MDT)

A small number of people may also have been exposed during a brief period of time while in one classroom. Those people will be contacted directly by AHS.

Anyone who attended any of these locations at these times, who was born in or after 1970 and has fewer than two documented doses of measles-containing vaccine, may be at risk for developing measles. [Learn more.](#)

If you suspect you may have been exposed, monitor for [symptoms of measles](#) and visit [Alberta Health Services' measles information webpage](#) for guidance on next steps. Call the Alberta Measles Hotline at 1-844-944-3434 before visiting any healthcare facility or provider, including a family physician clinic or pharmacy.

To protect yourself and others, check your immunization record to ensure you are fully immunized online (myhealth.alberta.ca) or by calling the Alberta Measles Hotline. The measles vaccine is highly effective at preventing infection and complications. Eligible students, spouses of students, faculty and staff can get their measles immunizations at the [University Health Centre](#).

Help keep the campus community healthy by staying at home or in your dorm room when sick. If you are feeling sick, notify your instructor or supervisor about your absence from work or school and learn about the [academic accommodations and wellness services](#) that are in place to support you. Students in residence should notify residence services at residence.support@ualberta.ca immediately if they suspect they may have contracted measles.
